Chrysis Linnaeus, 1761

- Largest genus of Chrysididae with >1000 species
- >70 species groups
- 4 species groups and 17 species in the UK
- Polyphyletic in relation to *Chrysura*, *Trichrysis* etc.
- Parasites of Eumeninae, Megachilidae, Sphecidae and Crabronidae

Chrysis ignita group


- Largest species group of *Chrysis* with > 100 species worldwide
- 13 species in the UK, which belong to 4 subgroups
 - Monophyletic
 - Parasites of Eumeninae
 - Species morphologically similar














Punctuation of tergites

Shape of apical teeth







Shape of apical teeth


Colour of sternites



pronotal furrow






Length of antennal









Lateral margin of T3





Apical truncation of T3






